- * I am a member of the armed forces of the United States and am in Alaska solely by reason of competent military orders.
* I am not a legal resident of the State of Alaska. The State of is my legal residence.
* I have not changed my legal residence by any act or declaration of intent to establish domicile or legal residence elsewhere.
* This vehicle is not used in a trade or business conducted in the state.
* I am the registered owner, either solely or jointly, of the vehicle described above.

This affidavit is made pursuant to the provisions of Section 574, Title 50 USCA App (Soldier's and Sailor's Relief Act) for the purpose of claiming exemption from the registration tax of the State of Alaska.

Additional Information:

Residents of other states stationed in Alaska:

The Military Affidavit is only for residents of other states that are stationed in Alaska and have no intention of changing their residency to Alaska. In lieu of the affidavit, a current LES (within 90 days) is acceptable proof of residency outside of Alaska.

This also applies to vehicles owned jointly by a member of the Armed Forces and one or more of their dependents. If a vehicle is owned solely by a dependent, the military exemption cannot be used.

The military exemption exempts the vehicle owner from paying Motor Vehicle Registration Taxes, therefore, if you do not reside in a tax location, the military exemption is not necessary. All other fees and emissions testing requirements must be met. For Canadian Military, please contact the web master for additional information.

Residents of Alaska stationed outside of Alaska:

Military Alaska residents stationed outside of Alaska may use their actual address where they are stationed rather than an Alaska address. If you keep your address current, you will continue to receive renewal notices, and will be exempt from Motor Vehicle Registration Taxes and emissions requirements in Alaska until you return. If the state you are living in has emissions requirements, it is best to check with the local DMV to assure you are in compliance with state laws.

A military exemption cannot be changed during a vehicle registration period.
